The Prayer Book directs the clergy to "instruct the people...to make wills, while they are in health, arranging for the disposal of their temporal goods, not neglecting, if they are able, to leave bequests for religious and charitable uses." During this drop-in time, Joslyn+ and others will talk through funeral planning and two of our parish's attorneys will be on hand to answer basic questions about wills and charitable bequests.
