On Saturday, a group of around 25 enjoyed lunch and a film, *Hidden Rivers of the Southern Appalachia*, with discussion and reflections about the beauty of our waterways and the many life forms they contain. The film, produced in partnership with the Tennessee Aquarium, features underwater photography of freshwater fish, mussels, and salamanders as it highlights the work of conservationists and biologists who are trying to save species from extinction. Following the film, a group of 11 hikers, led by May Alice Lodico, experienced the beauty of an Appalachian river, the East Fork of the Pigeon River, which flowed alongside the trail at Camp Daniel Boone.
